USING YOUR ROLL CARTS

DO:

- ✓ Place roll carts at the curb by 6:00 a.m.
- ✓ Bag and place all garbage inside the green lid roll cart
- Close the lids
- Place roll carts so that handles face the house and are turned away from the street
- ✓ Have at least three feet of clearance around the carts.
- ✓ Place carts on opposite side of the mailbox away from parked cars and low-hanging limbs

DON'T:

- X Place trash on top of or around roll carts
- X Overload the roll carts
- X Place roll carts within three feet of your mailbox or parked cars

KEEP THE FOLLOWING ITEMS OUT OF YOUR ROLL CARTS

X Oil, gas, car parts, lead acid batteries

X Hot ash or coals

FREQUENTLY ASKED

Q. Can I use my own garbage cans for automated collection?

A. No. You must use the county-provided roll carts for garbage and recyclables. Automated collection requires standardized, heavy-duty containers that will work with the trucks and leave the streets clean.

Q. What do I do with my old cans?

A. You are encouraged to keep your old cans for yard waste collection. Yard waste will still be collected manually at curbside in your own containers or in bundles and/or bags. Bundle tree and shrub clipping into lengths of three feet or less and tie with string or twine. Each bag, can, or bundle must weight less than 60 pounds.

Q. How do I dispose of garbage that will not fit into my green lid cart?

A. Residents may call the Solid Waste Hotline at 407-836-6601 to arrange for large item collection.

Q. Will services be provided during the holidays?

holidays will A. The only collection Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. When these holidays fall on a regular scheduled collection day, the carts will be picked up one day after the normally scheduled collection day for the rest of the week.

Q. What do I do with my current 18-gallon recycling bins?

A. We encourage you to keep the bins for other household purposes. You may call the Solid Waste Hotline to arrange for recycling of any unwanted bins.

Q. Can I request a different size roll cart?

A. Between April 1, 2016, and May 31, 2016, a one-time size change to a 65-gallon roll cart can be arranged by calling the Solid Waste Hotline at 407-836-6601 or sending an email to Solid.Waste@ocfl.net. Roll cart size changes after May 31, 2016, will incur a charge equivalent to the cost of a cart.
